PRESIDENT'S *Message*

2020 has been a challenging year to say the least. Looking back on our plan for this year, and reflecting on how things had to quickly change, I am proud how we responded to the needs of our catchment area given the realities of the pandemic.

A huge thank you

to my Board of Directors who showed strength, flexibility and incredible commitment in a year like no other in our history.

Notwithstanding that we were unable to move forward with key fundraising events, we find ourselves in a very healthy financial position. We continued to recover well from the 2018 financial market downturn and through this healthier market and growth of existing funds and the addition of new funds; our assets are at approximately \$4.7 million.

The ongoing support we receive from our donors, sponsors and partners strengthens our commitment to our mandate of Building a Lasting Legacy and our resolve to maintain and build upon the exceptional quality of life that we enjoy.

Our year began with a matching partnership with Manitoba 150 which enabled us to address a number of needs within our catchment. This was quickly followed by the onset of Covid and as the effects of the pandemic began to unfold, we recognized our obligation to take a leadership role within our communities and do everything we could to support the not for profits that had been, and continue to be, most negatively affected.

Through drawing from our Community Endowment Fund and forging strategic partnerships with like-minded organizations, we developed our own Covid support program and were pleased to be able to quickly respond in a very effective way.

As the dust began to clear on this program, we entered our traditional granting cycle and were pleased to support most of the applications that were submitted.

As this wound down, the Federal Government announced the Emergency Community Support Fund designed to help community organizations serve vulnerable Canadians during the COVID-19 crisis. The design and administration of the program relied heavily on the involvement of Community Foundations across Canada and Westshore was successful in securing maximum funding available to Foundations of our size. We distributed the entire amount to organizations within our catchment through an application and assessment process and partially through this success, we were able to secure additional funding through the second phase of the program. We again were able to funnel support directly into the hands of our organizations who were working so hard to serve our communities.

So, traditionally, our one annual round of granting changed to five rounds of granting this past year. It has been a tremendous amount of work but we are proud to have been able to accomplish these levels of support. As I write this year-end report, we have received an additional generous gift from one of our steadfast supporters with the request to distribute to several catchment organizations and we are in the process of doing so now.

Along with this unprecedented level of grant related support, our Scholarship program continues to support deserving students in their pursuits of post-secondary studies. We were able to celebrate the accomplishments of these very deserving students, in an outdoor covid compliant way, in early October. It was a wonderful late afternoon event held on the shores of our beautiful lake.

In a “normal” year, our grant and scholarship programs will see us place approximately \$70,000 within our catchment. This year, that support grew to approximately \$200,000!

We look forward to 2021 with renewed optimism. We will continue to explore new partnership funding opportunities and we look forward to supporting organizations and individuals who enable us to continue to build a lasting legacy in our community.

BUILDING A LASTING LEGACY

A wide variety of endowment funds available at Westshore to meet your charitable goals:

1

The Westshore Scholarship & Bursary Fund

Established in 2005, provides scholarships to assist students within our mandate to pursue post-secondary education.

2

The Carole Ann Clark Memorial Scholarship & Bursary Fund

This fund was established in 2008 from a bequest by the late Carole Ann Clark to assist students within our mandate to pursue post-secondary education. Preference will be given to students pursuing studies in the field of education/teaching.

3

The Alison Olson Memorial Scholarship & Bursary Fund

Established in 2014 from a bequest by the late Alison Olson, this fund seeks to assist students within our mandate to pursue post-secondary education.

4

The Larry & Helen Kristjanson Family Bursary Fund

Established in 2011, this fund provides a bursary annually to assist a Gimli High School student who has good potential and needs financial assistance to pursue a post-secondary education goal.

5

The Lilja Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund

Established in 2015 by the Martin Family in memory of their late mother, Lilja Martin. Lilja was a well-known piano teacher in the Interlake Region for many years. She was an inspiration to her students and made an enduring contribution to the musical culture of our community. This Fund provides scholarships annually to worthy piano students participating in the Evergreen Festival of the Arts.

6

The Dr. Elaine Sigurdson Memorial Scholarship

Established by the Sigurdson Family in 2018 in memory of their beloved daughter and sister, the late Dr. Elaine Sigurdson. This Fund supports students who have graduated from the Evergreen School Division pursue studies in the Undergraduate Medical Education Program and the Master of Physician Assistant Studies Program at the University of Manitoba.

7

The Tim And Delphine Arnason Scholarship Fund

In recognition of the importance of music in their lives, this Fund was established by Tim & Del Arnason in 2018 to assist a graduating student from the Gimli High School to pursue their post-secondary education in a field of music and/or in the teaching of music.

8

Community Fund

Our largest fund from which the Westshore Board of Directors provides annual grants to charitable organizations to assist the communities within our mandate in the areas of the environment, heritage & culture, sports & recreation, community services, health and education.

9

The Verna Palmer Memorial Fund

A designated fund established in 2006 “to support people within the Foundation’s geographical responsibility who are in need of assistance to better their lives with priority given to the needs of women and children”. This fund divides its grants between the Evergreen Basic Needs and the Interlake Women’s Resource Centre.

10

Palliative Care Fund

Established in 2007 this fund supports the activities and services of the Northeast Palliative Care Program operating out of the Gimli Community Health Centre.

11

The Gimli Lutheran Church Endowment Fund

This is an agency fund established in 2008 by the Gimli Lutheran Church, the annual income from which is used at the discretion of the Church to further its goals and in ways that are consistent with its mandate.

12

The New Iceland Heritage Museum Endowment Fund

This is an agency fund established in 2008 by the New Iceland Heritage Museum Inc. The annual income is used at the sole discretion of the museum in pursuit of its particular goals and in a manner consistent with its mandate.

13

The Marj & Oli Narfason Endowment Fund

A donor advised fund established in 2008 by Marj & Oli Narfason. This fund under the direction and at the discretion of the Narfason’s seeks to support charitable causes in the areas of the arts, the environment, education and heritage.

14

Administration Endowment Fund

A fund established in 2010 by the Westshore Board of Directors to assist with covering administrative expenses incurred by the Board in pursuing the goals and objectives of the Westshore Community Foundation.

15

The Ted & Alison Olson Fund

Established in 2012 by Alison Olson in memory of her late husband, Ted Olson. This fund supports charitable causes which promote worthy endeavours in the fields of education, the care and benefit of animals, the care of &/or activities of Senior citizens and the upkeep &/or enhancement of the Gimli Cemetery.

16

The Westshore Interlake-Eastern Healthcare Fund

Established in 2015 by the Westshore Community Foundation and the Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority to promote healthcare and to address identified health needs within the former Johnson Memorial Hospital District.

17

The Evergreen Foundation of Manitoba Endowment Fund

An Agency Fund established in 2017 by the Evergreen Foundation of Manitoba. The annual income is used at the sole discretion of the Evergreen Foundation in pursuit of its particular goals and in a manner consistent with its mandate.

18

The Heritage - New Iceland Heritage Museum Fund

This is an Agency Fund established by the New Iceland Heritage Museum under the Manitoba Heritage Trust Program. This Program will provide 50 cents to the Fund for every private dollar donated to the Fund from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2021 to a guaranteed maximum grant of \$25,000. Further matching monies may be available depending upon the availability of unused monies within the Program.

19

The Evergreen Basic Needs Endowment Fund

An Agency Fund established in 2019 by the Evergreen Basic Needs Committee Inc. This fund seeks to generate and distribute earnings to that organization to be used at its discretion to meet its particular charitable mandate. Evergreen Basic Needs works to eliminate hunger and food insecurity through food distribution at its Food Bank and through education and support programs in partnership and co-operation with the community.

20

Westshore Youth Fund

The purpose of this endowment fund, established in 2019, is to support worthy activities and needs of youth in the Westshore Community Foundation catchment area.

21

The Gimli Film Festival Endowment Fund

An Agency Fund established in 2020 to support the Gimli Film Festival's mandate to educate, engage, inspire and empower through the medium of film.

22

The Icelandic Festival of Manitoba Fund

An Agency Fund established in 2020 with earnings to be used at their discretion to meet their charitable mandate of promoting & sustaining interest in Icelandic Culture and Heritage. This fund was transferred from the Winnipeg Foundation in 2020.

New Iceland Heritage Museum Inc. Signature Museum Sustainability Fund


