That plan involves our continuing efforts to:


- Connect with communities within our catchment area
- Enhance donor relations through engagement and stewardship
- Provide mentorship in our granting and scholarship programs
- Increase our focus on both youth and age friendly groups
- Promote fund development through education and awareness of our Foundation
- Enlist corporate sponsorship to assist in our fundraising efforts.

As you can see from our Strategic Plan, our Foundation continues to recognize that communities are complex and that collaboration between multiple stakeholders is needed to help everyone thrive and evolve. We have maintained our commitment to seeing the community succeed by identifying and understanding our community's needs and creating and maintaining community-based partnerships that support effective solutions to local issues. Through the generosity of our donors and willing volunteers working together, we have an even greater opportunity to support the ongoing needs of our communities along the west shore of Lake Winnipeg.

The spring found our Granting Committee fully involved in our annual granting cycle. Since 1998, we have funded \$1.18 million in grants and scholarships within our catchment area. This year, we awarded \$50,000 in grants to support the projects of 20 locally based charitable organizations. Through our alliances with both Endow Manitoba and Community Foundations Canada, we continue to gain access to additional granting opportunities, such as the Investment Readiness Program and the Community Services Recovery Fund to assist charitable organizations to rebound in this recovery period.

Our Events and Marketing Committees were busy over the summer months in preparation for our major summer fundraiser, the 18th Annual Lakeview Gimli Resort & Westshore Community Foundation Benefit Golf Tournament which was held on August 22, 2022 at the Links on the Lake golf course in Gimli. The weather co-operated and the tournament was a huge success raising \$15,421.13. Lakeview's support of our Foundation over these many years has been outstanding and we feel very fortunate for this partnership.

At our Annual Donor Appreciation and Awards Night in October, we had the opportunity to thank our sponsors and donors for their contributions to Westshore Community Foundation over the past year. Our success is your success. During the evening, grant recipients had the opportunity to talk about the impact that our granting program has on our catchment area. We also celebrated the accomplishments of local students by awarding a total of \$33,846 to 16 worthy recipients through our scholarship program. These scholarships continue to provide students with the much-needed financial



resources required to allow them to achieve their post-secondary goals.

November saw us again participating in the province wide 2022 Endow Manitoba Giving Challenge. Through the generous support of you, our donors, and matching funds from the Winnipeg Foundation and the Province of Manitoba, we had the most successful Challenge ever, raising \$27,075 for our Community Fund. This financial support allows us to continue to fund innovative projects, both large and small, in areas such as the environment, heritage and culture, sport and recreation, community services and health and education.

We closed our year with the 2022 New Year's Gala, an evening filled with wonderful fun, food, fellowship and music. It was great to be able to gather again and all who attended had an enjoyable evening.

To assist those who wish to create a lasting legacy through an Endowment Fund, the Fund Development Committee was created to provide assistance to those interested in establishing an Endowment Fund tailored specifically to their charitable goals. We currently have 26 such Endowment Funds at WCF.

In closing, I want to thank you, our donors, for your continuous support of our Foundation. Your generous donations over the past year have helped us to fulfill our mission of "Building a Lasting Legacy" for all of us who live along the west shore of Lake Winnipeg.

Gimli Children's Centre, Update Playroom Shelving and Countertop Project:

The Gimli Children's Centre was in need of new shelving and countertops to replace the old and tired shelving and countertops. The need for wipeable surfaces for easy sanitization and maintenance became apparent during Covid and has become the new normal at the daycare.

These new cuphoards provide much needed storage space and new workstations for the playrooms. The Westshore Community Foundation has been a long time supporter of the Gimli Daycare.

Meleb Park Renewal Project

The Westshore Community Foundation approved a grant for the Meleb Park Renewal project. The Park committee has been working to renew the exhibits at the park to ensure that the park is around for another generation. The grant was for a new highway sign, and for painting of the old school buildings. This park is also home to the giant Morel Mushroom.

Gimli Glider Museum Inc. Travel Exhibit and Virtual Tour Project

The Westshore Community Foundation approved a grant for the Gimli Glider Phase 2 of the Travel Exhibit and production of a Virtual Tour. The travel exhibit will be used at several locations to promote the Gimli Glider Museum in Gimli. The virtual tour will be used in conjunction with the travel exhibit to further promote the museum. Marketing the museum is important as 2023 is the 40th anniversary of the famous Gimli Glider with special events taking place through the summer.

Village of Dunnottar Beach Access for All Project

The Village Of Dunnottar with their Beach Access for All has purchased a "Moby Chair", as seen in the photo. This chair will be available for use on the beach in Matlock for anyone with mobility issues to be able to access and enjoy the waters of Lake Winnipeg. The use of wheelchairs and even canes are problematic on the sandy beaches so the Moby Chair can get you from the shore to the water with ease. The large wheels keep the chair buoyant and creates an "in the water" experience for the user. This will be a great asset for those whom before were unable to spend time in the water.



BUILDING A LASTING

A wide variety of endowment funds available at Westshore to meet your charitable goals

What Is An Endowment?

A Donor contributes a sum of money that is invested and put into a separately identified fund, the use of which is governed by a written Fund Agreement between the Donor and the Foundation. A permanent endowment seeks to preserve the capital, keep some earnings for growth to offset inflation and provide monies to distribute annually to promote a particular charitable cause / organization chosen by the Donor and outlined within the Fund Agreement.

It is truly a perpetual gift that keeps on giving to further a Donor's long term charitable goals!





Establishing an endowment fund at the Westshore Community Foundation is a simple and effective way of individuals or organizations building a sustainable income stream for their favorite charitable cause or charity. Westshore handles all administrative responsibilities and investment management while the donor focuses fully on their charitable goals.

The types of Funds that can be established are varied, but fit into a number of different categories which are firstly defined below and then specific examples are given of this Fund type offered at Westshore. This list is meant to assist donors in deciding where to put their donation and to assist those interested in establishing their own endowment to further their charitable goals.

A. COMMUNITY FUNDS

Usually this is a Fund established in a community or covering a specific geographical area for general charitable purposes managed by a foundation enabling it to respond to a broad range and the everchanging variety of community needs and opportunities. Often these Funds are referred to as unrestricted, undesignated or discretionary funds.

The Westshore Community Fund

Our largest fund from which the Westshore Board of Directors provides annual grants to charitable organizations and qualified donees to assist the communities within our geographical mandate in the areas of the environment, heritage & culture, sports & recreation, community services, health and education.

If you are looking for a way to help make your community a better place without any specific purpose in mind this super flexible option could very well be your best choice!

B. SCHOLARSHIP and/or BURSARY FUNDS:

This Fund provides scholarship/bursary awards to deserving students based on equitable and legitimate criteria, such as acceptance in a certain area of study/course, residence in a specified geographical area, graduation/attendance at a certain school and proficiency in a specified academic field etc. Westshore helps you define the award criteria, handles administrative details and makes the award to deserving students in the name of the Fund you establish.

The Westshore Scholarship & Bursary Fund

Established in 2005, our largest and most flexible Fund in this category provides scholarships to assist students from within our mandate to pursue various types (university, community college, trade school etc.) of post-secondary education. It provides awards to high school graduates, continuing post-secondary students and mature students.

The Carole Ann Clark Memorial Scholarship & Bursary Fund

This fund was established in 2008 from a bequest by the late Carole Ann Clark to assist students within our mandate to pursue post-secondary education. Preference will be given to students pursuing studies in the field of education/teaching.

The Alison Olson Memorial Scholarship & Bursary Fund

Established in 2014 from a bequest by the late Alison Olson, this fund seeks to assist students within our mandate to pursue post-secondary education.

The Larry & Helen Kristjanson Family Bursary Fund

Established in 2011, this fund provides a bursary annually to assist a Gimli High School student who has good potential and needs financial assistance to pursue a post-secondary education goal.

The Lilja Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund

Established in 2015 by the Martin Family in memory of their late mother, Lilja Martin. Lilja was a well-known piano teacher in the Interlake Region for many years. She was an inspiration to her students and made an enduring contribution to the musical culture of our community. This Fund provides scholarships annually to worthy piano students participating in the Evergreen Festival of the Arts.

The Dr. Elaine Sigurdson Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2018 by Barrie & Ardith Sigurdson, along with Barrie's parents Alma and Raymond in memory of their beloved daughter and sister, the late Dr. Elaine Sigurdson. This Fund supports students who have graduated from the Evergreen School Division to pursue studies in the Undergraduate Medical Education Program and the Master of Physician Assistant Studies Program at the University of Manitoba

The Tim And Delphine Arnason Scholarship Fund

In recognition of the importance of music in their lives, this Fund was established by Tim & Del Arnason in 2018 to assist a graduating student from the Gimli High School to pursue their post-secondary education in a field of music and/or in the teaching of music.

The Robert Arnason Memorial Scholarship Fund*

Established by Robert's family in 2022, in loving memory of a community leader and dedicated educator, to provide an annual post-secondary scholarship to a Gimli High School graduate who has demonstrated a commitment to community service.

C. AGENCY FUNDS:

Registered charities can establish this kind of Fund to provide a permanent source of funding for their organization. It provides the charity with another instrument to encourage supporting donations often of a larger size since the donor knows that a trusted community foundation is managing the Fund to provide an ongoing income stream so the charity can concentrate on its particular charitable goals.

The Evergreen Basic Needs Endowment Fund

An agency fund established in 2019 by the Evergreen Basic Needs Committee Inc. This fund seeks to generate and distribute earnings to that organization to be used at its discretion to meet its particular charitable mandate. Evergreen Basic Needs works to eliminate hunger and food insecurity through food distribution at its Food Bank and through education and support programs in partnership and co-operation with the community.

The Evergreen Foundation of Manitoba Endowment Fund

An agency fund established in 2017 by the Evergreen Foundation of Manitoba. The annual income is used at the sole discretion of the Evergreen Foundation in pursuit of its particular goals and in a manner consistent with its mandate.

The Gimli Film Festival Endowment Fund

An agency fund established in 2020 to support the Gimli Film Festival's mandate to educate, engage, inspire and empower through the medium of film.

The Gimli Lutheran Church Endowment Fund

This is an agency fund established in 2008 by the Gimli Lutheran Church, the annual income from which is used at the discretion of the Church to further its goals and in ways that are consistent with its mandate.



An agency fund established in 2021 under the Manitoba Heritage Trust Program. The income from this Fund is used at the sole discretion of the Museum in pursuit of its particular goals "To Educate, Enlighten & Entertain" and in a manner consistent with its mandate to tell the heroic story of Air Canada Flight 143 on July 23, 1983.

The Heritage - New Iceland Heritage Museum Fund

This is an agency Fund established in 2018 by the New Iceland Heritage Museum under the Manitoba Heritage Trust Program. In 2021, the Museum's agency fund established in 2008 was transferred into this Fund. The annual income from this Fund is used at the sole discretion of the museum in pursuit of its particular goals and in a manner consistent with its mandate.

The Icelandic Festival of Manitoba Fund

An Agency Fund established in 2020 with earnings to be used at their discretion to meet their charitable mandate of promoting & sustaining interest in Icelandic culture and heritage.

D. DESIGNATED FUNDS:

These are Funds that name specific charities that will be supported. Westshore manages the annual distribution to these charities.

Administration Endowment Fund

A fund established in 2010 by the Westshore Board of Directors to assist with covering administrative expenses incurred by the Board in pursuing the goals and objectives of the Westshore Community Foundation.

New Iceland Heritage Museum Inc. Signature Museum Sustainability Fund

This designated fund was established in 2020 by the Government of Manitoba to provide a long term sustainable revenue stream for the purpose of operating the Museum. Specifically, to support development activities in the following areas of governance & management, museum standards, and visitor experience.

Palliative Care Fund

Established in 2007 this fund supports the activities and services of the Northeast Palliative Care Program operating out of the Gimli Community Health Centre.

The Verna Palmer Memorial Fund

A designated fund established in 2006 "to support people within the Foundation's geographical responsibility who are in need of assistance to better their lives with priority given to the needs of women and children". This fund divides its grants between the Evergreen Basic Needs and the Interlake Women's Resource Centre.

YOUR CHARITABLE GOALS

E. FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS:

This type of Fund specifies an area of interest when the Fund is established without limitation to a specific organization or beneficiary. Westshore makes the decision about which organization(s) to support taking your interests and the governing fund agreement into consideration. Typical examples of different fields of interest are: education, healthcare, youth etc. and can range from very broad to very narrow in scope.

The Community Arts Fund

An initiative of Marj & Oli Narfason to support musical and visual arts education by assisting musical and visual arts programs and their supporting organizations maintained by schools within the Westshore catchment area. They hope the community will use this Fund to rally in support of educating our young people in these essential arts to strengthen their personal development and to build a healthy and vibrant community.

The Save The Lake Endowment Fund

This Fund was established in 2021 by the Gimli Yacht Club and the Kiwanis Club of Gimli and District to support organizations whose purpose and whose advocacy, research and educational activities aim to protect, sustain and rejuvenate Lake Winnipeg and its watershed ecosystem.

The Ted & Alison Olson Fund

Established in 2012 by Alison Olson in memory of her late husband, Ted Olson. This fund supports charitable causes which promote worthy endeavours in the fields of education, the care and benefit of animals, the care of &/or activities of Senior citizens and the up keep &/or enhancement of the Gimli Cemetery.

The Westshore Environmental Fund*

This Fund was created in 2022 by the Board of Directors of the Westshore Community Foundation. The purpose of this Fund will be to conserve our natural environment, to support climate change initiatives, to assist projects related to the improvement of water, air and food supply, including related education and citizen engagement, and to build the capacity of the local environmental sector. It is intended that this Fund will focus efforts to meet these objectives primarily, but not exclusively on improving the health and sustainability of Lake Winnipeg.

The Westshore Interlake-Eastern Healthcare Fund

Established in 2015 by the Westshore Community Foundation and the Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority to promote healthcare and to address identified health needs within the former Johnson Memorial Hospital District.

Westshore Youth Fund

The purpose of this endowment fund, established in 2019, is to support worthy activities and needs of youth in the Westshore Community Foundation catchment area.

F. DONOR ADVISED FUNDS:

In this type of Fund, the donor or successor make recommendations annually to Westshore about which charities are to be supported with the available fund distribution. The grant purpose must be charitable and in support of a registered Canadian charity or other qualified donee as defined by the Canada Revenue Agency. Westshore reviews the proposed grants to ensure eligibility and handles the distribution in the name of your Fund.

The Marj & Oli Narfason Endowment Fund

A donor advised fund established in 2008 by Marj & Oli Narfason. This fund under the direction and at the discretion of the Narfarson's seeks to support charitable causes in the areas of the arts, the environment, education and heritage.

If you want ongoing involvement with your endowment and participation in where the annual distributions go, this type of Fund could be the best solution!
